## 51. Proverbs 15 - Contrasts Between the Wise and Foolish.

Their Accountability and Humility. Proverbs 15:29-33
Review: Vs 29 - Their power in prayer.

## 2. The righteous' countenance and report.

${ }^{30}$ The light of the eyes rejoiceth the heart: And a good report maketh the bones fat.

- Vs 30 gives parallel principles.

Someone with life / light in their eyes pulls the heart into joy.
Be someone that thrills the hearts of others.
Proverbs 15:13 A merry heart maketh a cheerful countenance: But by sorrow of the heart the spirit is broken.
Proverbs 15:23 A man hath joy by the answer of his mouth: And a word spoken in due season, how good is it!

- Things to think about over this principle.

Does your look discourage or $\qquad$ ?

Are you $\qquad$ to see the people that God has placed in your life?

Conversely: Don't $\qquad$ people. Think. Then speak. Finish and respect the time of others.
The conclusion of the matter: We need to be there for each other.
1 Corinthians 13:7 Beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things. Ephesians 4:1-3 I therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called, ${ }^{2}$ With all lowliness and meekness, with longsuffering, forbearing one another in love; ${ }^{3}$ Endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

Many people that hijack your time are needy of affirmation, love and acceptance.

How can I quit being a me-monster? Seek to serve. Look and seek to be a blessing.
Galatians 5:13-14 For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only use not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another. ${ }^{14}$ For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even in this; Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.

- A good report strengthens you to the $\qquad$ !
Proverbs 17:22 A merry heart doeth good like a medicine: But a broken spirit drieth the bones.
- Bad news is discouraging! Depression can be deadly.

Bad report! Example: Eli the priest. 1 Samuel 2:24, 27-36; 4:12-18

- "And a good report maketh the bones fat."
- Consider: if your report is always despair, or humble brag - that's obnoxious.

How can I quit being a me-monster? Put on the new man. Live Christ.
Let the joy of the Lord be your strength, and then, let all things fall out to edification of those that God has placed in your life!
Romans 14:19 Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace, and things wherewith one may edify another.
1 Corinthians 14:26b ...Let all things be done unto edifying.
2 Corinthians 12:19b ...but we do all things, dearly beloved, for your edifying.

Philippians 1:27 Only let your conversation be as it becometh the gospel of Christ: that whether I come and see you, or else be absent, I may hear of your affairs, that ye stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel;
1 Timothy 4:12 Let no man despise thy youth; but be thou an example of the believers, in word, in conversation, in charity, in spirit, in faith, in purity.

- Is how l'm communicating $\qquad$ the center of attention or is it $\qquad$ ?


## 3. The wise listen to reproof. Vs 31-33

${ }^{31}$ The ear that heareth the reproof of life Abideth among the wise. ${ }^{32} \mathrm{He}$ that refuseth instruction despiseth his own soul: But he that heareth reproof getteth understanding.

- This is by now a clear and understood principle!

Proverbs 1:23, 25, 30; 3:11; 5:12; 6:23; 10:17; 12:1; 13:18; 15:5, 10, 32; 27:5; 29:1, 15, etc.
Proverbs 6:23 For the commandment is a lamp; and the law is light; And reproofs of instruction are the way of life:

- The wise love to $\qquad$ . They want to be $\qquad$ !
Proverbs 9:7-9 He that reproveth a scorner getteth to himself shame: And he that rebuketh a wicked man getteth himself a blot. ${ }^{8}$ Reprove not a scorner, lest he hate thee: Rebuke a wise man, and he will love thee. ${ }^{9}$ Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be yet wiser: Teach a just man, and he will increase in learning.
${ }^{33}$ The fear of the Lord is the instruction of wisdom; And before honour is humility.
- Again, vs 33 - parallel principles.

The $\qquad$ : fear of the Lord.
Consider...
Luke 1:52 He hath put down the mighty from their seats, and exalted them of low degree.
James 4:6 But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble.
I must humble myself - even the Lord Himself sets this example.
Philippians 2:5-11 Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus: ${ }^{6}$ Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God: ${ }^{7}$ But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: ${ }^{8}$ And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross. ${ }^{9}$ Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name: ${ }^{10}$ That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; ${ }^{11}$ And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
4. The wicked refuse to listen. Vs 32.
${ }^{32}$ He that refuseth instruction despiseth his own soul: But he that heareth reproof getteth understanding.

- Again, this is by now a clear and understood principle!

Prov. 1:2, 3, 7, 8; 3:11, etc.

- Notice why people refuse instruction. They don't respect $\qquad$ .
The critical warning...
Proverbs 15:10 Correction is grievous unto him that forsaketh the way: And he that hateth reproof shall die.
refuses to listen. It isn't $\qquad$ for the flesh to embrace reproof.
Proverbs 12:1 Whoso loveth instruction loveth knowledge: But he that hateth reproof is brutish.
Proverbs 1:7 The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge: But fools despise wisdom and instruction.
