VS 9. Church! We're called with an holy calling. 1 Corinthians 1:23–29

Implications: 2 Timothy 1:11-12

If the Holy calling in verse 9 was given to us, those who are saved, in Christ Jesus before the world began... and understanding that when Christ appeared, He abolished death, and brought life and immortality to light through the Gospel, **then** that means two things from vs's 11 and 12...

We are, like Paul, are to live for the Gospel. Secondly, we know that it is worth suffering for!
