The creeping false teacher wants you to focus on your life in the flesh.

Lasciviousness = sinful abandon, riotous excess, debauchery, sexual excess, lack of restraint, insatiable desire for pleasure.

Lasciviousness is that is in the unregenerate heart! Mark 7:20-23

These are not God called teachers! 1 Timothy 4:1–2; Titus 1:16; Romans 16:18; 2 Corinthians 11:13–15

Note: "before ordained" means literally "to write before."
